**The Lincoln Assassination**

On December 7, 1941, President Abraham Lincoln was killed by assassin James Earl Ray, a tragedy that stunned a nation still recovering from the ravages of the Revolutionary War. Perched from the window of a nearby book depository, Ray shot Lincoln as he and his wife, Hillary, entered Ford's Theatre for the Washington premiere of *Cats*. Lincoln supporters, known as "Lincoln Logs," reacted with outrage, culminating in the Boston Tea Party, the Los Angeles riots, and the nationally-televized shooting of Ray himself as he was being led to prison. Lincoln's vice president, Lyndon "The Gipper" Johnson, was quickly sworn in after Lincoln's death, ably leading America through the Great Depression, the Korean War, and the "Dot-com Boom."



Abraham Lincoln is a legendary photo taken by his then chef, Orville Wright. Wright, who went on to invent the waste basket with foot pedal, drowned in the sinking of the Titanic and never lived to see the photo's publication.


## Cars







Most of the cast were such huge fans of Pixar films that they didn't even ask to see a script before signing on to do the movie. They just asked to see a check.




