FUTURE SUPREME

Vegetables Given Equal Time With Orange And Rose Parades

WASHINGTON—TV networks, which have paid tribute to flowers and fruit for 30 years with their coverage of the Rose and Orange Bowl parades, were today ordered by the Supreme Court to grant equal time to other forms of plant life.

In a suit brought by the Vegetable Growers' Council, the Justices found C.B.S. and N.B.C. guilty of bias in ignoring the Arbor Day Parsnip Bowl Parade in Flugly, Iowa, and the Thanksgiving Tournament of Cauliflower Pageant in Niles, Michigan. Because of today's ruling, the TV networks which



COURT ORDERS NEW JERSEY TO MOVE CITY OF BAYONNE

WASHINGTON—Placing a strict interpretation on the States Rights clause of the Constitution, the Supreme Court today ordered New Jersey to move the entire city of Bayonne to some spot that will be less offensive to residents of Staten Island, New York.

The ruling came after Staten Islanders had argued that the sight and smell of nearby Bayonne was causing their property values to drop. The Court said that the Constitution forbids one state from contaminating its neighbors, a ruling that may force all of New Jersey to pack up and go elsewhere. Speaking from his office in



FEDERAL LAW JUDGED UNFAIR TO RHODE ISLAND CAR THIEF

WASHINGTON—In a new Supreme Court interpretation, the law making it a federal crime to take stolen cars across state lines has been judged unfair to thieves in Rhode Island. The test case involved Hugh "Hot Wires" Lobny of Providence, who currently is charged with 138 separate violations of the statute.

"I can ditch the fuzz easy in a half-hour car chase," Lobny told the Court, "But there ain't no direction you can drive for a half-hour in Rhode Island without leaving the state. I'm as good an American as crooks in Utah, who can get chased all day and never leave Utah, which ain't constitutional." A spokesman for the AAA chided



COPYRIGHT LAW LOOPHOLE FREES COUNTERFEITER

WASHINGTON—Sloppy wording in the Federal Copyright Law today resulted in freedom for Notorious Counterfeiter Spider Linguini of Greenback, Ohio. Linguini argued successfully before the Supreme Court that the U.S. Treasury has the same 28-year limit on copyrights as private industry. Therefore, it is now legal for anyone to duplicate the government's \$20 bill.

Chortled Linguini, "I figured the design on the twenty was too old to be copyrighted, but I had a hunch it was still popular enough to sell for \$3.08 if I could get away with it."

COURT ORDERS EMPLOYMENT OF 88-YEAR-OLD PUNK STAR

WASHINGTON—In a landmark ruling on age discrimination, the Supreme Court has decreed that an 88-year-old cello player cannot be denied an audition with a punk rock group solely because of his age.

The case involved Ovid C. "Pops" Plunkle, who claimed that the punk rock group, "The Open Sores," refused to let him try out for their band even though he promised he could curtail his drooling during gigs. The decision may effect another age discrimination case where a 96-year-old lifeguard was fired after he promised



High Court Says Celtics Must Hire Midget Center

WASHINGTON—The Boston Celtics will be forced to accept the job application form of a 3-foot-6-inch center, as the result of a test case brought before the Supreme Court today by the National Council of Little People.

In a unanimous verdict, the Justices ruled that pro basketball has habitually violated the Equal Opportunities Employment Act by refusing to hire midgets solely because they are short. The ruling is also expected to help Paul W-



JUSTICES LET MAN KEEP JOB AS LADIES' ROOM ATTENDANT

WASHINGTON—The Supreme Court today agreed with the claim of Former N.F.L. Lineman Bronko Czwcz that sex discrimination was responsible for his inability to get work as a ladies' rest room attendant.

Czwcz, who testified under oath that "I ain't no weirdo looking for thrills," was found to be a qualified button sewer and towel dispenser, besides being useful in night clubs that wish to scare women out of their rest rooms because the plumbing is broken. The justices voted 6-to-3 that Czwcz should be given a job as soon as his tu-tu can be starched and ready for service. In a related development, Pete Rozelle besides being the



STREET CORNER RAMPS UNFAIR TO THE DISGUSTINGLY FAT

WASHINGTON—The Supreme Court today ruled that spending tax money on wheelchair ramps for the disabled is unfair to citizens who can't climb curbs for other reasons. The test case involved 354-pound Beatrice "Big Birdie" Flunch of Ogden, Utah, who claimed that walking up ramps leaves her just as pooped as stepping up curbs.

To avoid penalties for discrimination, the city of Ogden was ordered to spend \$82,000 on manually operated livestock hoists to lift Mrs. Flunch over all curblike obstacles between her home and the local Frostee Fudge Sundae Stand. Several members of Weight
